Instructor Highlight Walt McGhee Teaches Bagpipes!

A Journey From Student to Teacher:

Learning to Bagpipe

"I always liked the sound of bagpipes," says Walt McGhee when asked why he started learning to play. But even more he goes on, "I am also a proud 11th generation Scottish American." Walt's family emigrated from Scotland to the American

Colonies in 1653...a perfect incentive to try his hand at bagpiping.

In September 2017 FCAAE offered a class in bagpiping. On a whim, Walt took the class. He now says, "...the instrument took hold of me and soon became a way of life". And now that he's retired, it's playing an even larger part.

It has taken a fair amount of time and focus to get to where he is now, seven years later. "The bagpipe is a rather complicated instrument." says Walt McGhee. He continues, "There are 4 reeds



inside of the Great Highland bagpipe, so one could argue its like playing 4 instruments at once!"

And Walt's persistence has certainly paid off. He says that he has been "very fortunate to be able to play with the Carnegie Mellon University Pipes & Drums. Performing involves a lot of memorization. I've been "well over my skis" since the beginning and probably started performing too early. This experience has put me on an accelerated learning curve." Walt also competes with the EUSPBA (Eastern US Pipe Band Association). Pipers are judged and progress from Grade 5 (beginner) to Grade 1 (expert) and eventually to the professional level of Open Piper. Walt is a Grade 4 and is hoping to advance to Grade 3 in the fall. Good Luck, Walt!!

When asked about his biggest challenge with bagpiping, Walt admits: "For me it has been trying to keep up with the (CMU) band. I am surrounded by very good pipers. In one sense, it is helpful because it forces me to improve...The actual playing of the instrument brings me happiness and a sense of accomplishment."

Walt shares a tip to all aspiring bagpipers: "The key is to enjoy the journey and of course practice, practice, practice. Surprisingly, Pittsburgh is full of very good pipers and instructors. We're lucky in that regard."
